



This trail follows a portion of William Gillette's three mile long, narrow gauge railroad route.
Gillette's own walking paths were constructed with near-vertical steps, stone-arch bridges, and wooden trestles spanning up to forty feet.
This particular path winds through the woods, over a bridge, a trestle, and on to "the tunnel." Numerous trees, shrubs and ferns along the trail and around the lily pond have been identified for your interest.


